To install this scenery, unzip the file into your preferred location. Copy the RAF Honington folder into your main Flight Simulator 2004 \ Addon scenery folder. Start FS2004, and go to Settings\ Scenery Library. Click Add Area, browse to Addon scenery\Raf Honington, and click OK. Click OK and the close FS2004. Restart Fs2004 and go to Honington in the UK airports list.
